

Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Congregation,

I hope you are all gearing up for a great Summer! Even if everything is not back on line, much is, and what is, can be enjoyed! I think we need to push ourselves and get back into the spirit of things. With all that is going on, as Christians we keep our spirits strong and positive. So often Paul was in dire straits spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ but one thing he never did was let the situation claim his soul. Because of his relationship with God, he always had an answer for the difficulties he faced. In his second letter to the Corinthians he penned; ..."we are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed". We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body (2 Cor 4: 8-10). Don't get me wrong I know the hardships of life are hard and the pain and suffering can be overwhelming. But don't let the hardship have the last word. Have a response to it. And not just an answer but a heartfelt response with clear determination full of spirit and life. To ignore the hardship or try to avoid it will only lead to more difficulties; rarely have rose-colored glasses ever worked when dealing with the struggles we face. But let us take some advice from our forebears in the faith, like Paul, and use a different approach. They brought the hardship into their relationship with Christ. Take for example, one of my favorite quotes of Paul found in the same letter mentioned above; ...

"we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor 10: 5). The fact that we have our thoughts about a situation, or are dealing with the issues of others, either way, we do not give it the last word. No, we submit it before Christ and let Christ lead us through the situation. Of course, this may mean we need to be reading our Bible and praying as we make our way along. So many have adopted the idea they can pray about things and go on without ever reading their Bible or building a relationship with God. It doesn't work that way. One of the blessings of walking with God is the companionship God provides during hard times not just for you but also for your loved ones. So stay upbeat about life. Don't worry about the trials of life... let them come but then have a response. If you need a few things to be upbeat about, look to our church. We are continuing to do upgrades on and around the building. If you have any ideas be sure to let us know. A few things to add to your calendar are on April 14th at 4:00 pm we will have a Holy Week service. It will be a combination of the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services. On Easter Sunday, April 17, we will have our Easter celebration with a service at 9:00 am and Brunch afterward, come and join us!

Guidelines for the Memorial Garden

The Chapel in the Pines Memorial Garden committee met recently to discuss updates to the garden and to establish rules for its use. The committee is made up of Carol Baadte, Linda Messenger, and Art Davis. Be on the look-out for some wonderful changes to enhance our garden.

Please note below the new rules for the gardens use and if you have any questions, please let one of the Deacons know.

1. Any request for putting in any memorial for a loved one must be okayed by the Deacon Board, e.g. planting, digging, etc.

2. You can bury or scatter ashes but cannot bury actual urns.

3. No headstones or grave markers. There are memory bricks and if you are a member of CCCC our church will provide the brick.

4. A tube will be provided for you to place flowers but, it will be up to the family to remove old flowers.

5. Small plants can be planted and a special memorial item can be placed but must be approved before doing so. Please note that there is no sprinkler system for keeping plants alive.

We believe these rules will help everyone when we are grieving to know what we can do without adding additional stress for the church. We want your loved one to have a special place where you can visit whenever you like. We think our garden will provide that for you.
